

845 days of chemotherapy.57 days in the hospital.3 ambulance rides.No school.No sleepovers with friends.

Wish kid Anna's life changed completely after being diagnosed with leukemia at three-years-old.

"It was hard on Anna-her poor little body being pumped full of all kinds of horrific drugs, getting poked thousands of times, missing out on life as a child... it was hard on us too," reflected Anna's dad, Eric.

Wishes are powerful.

At Make-A-Wish OKI, we've seen wishes transform sick kids—giving them the hope, strength and joy they need to keep fighting their illness. Wish kid Andi's story is just one example of the power of a wish.

Growing up, 17-year-old Andi knew she could never enlist in the armed forces due to her battle with cystic fibrosis, but her lifelong dream remained to serve her country like her older sister in the U.S. Air Force and her grandfather who was a Marine. She chose a wish that would push her to the limits mentally and physically—she wished to be a U.S. Navy SEAL.

On the day her wish came true,
Andi trained alongside active SEALs,
conquering a 40-foot wall and parallel
bars as well as other physically challenging
obstacles. And she never gave up. As Andi
completed a final water exercise in the ocean, she felt
completely at peace as the waves crashed over her. In
that moment, she was transformed.

So impressed with her courage, Andi was named as the first female honorary Navy SEAL after her wish experience. Since then, Andi said she's more determined than ever to continue pursuing a career with the Navy, perhaps behind the camera as a Navy photographer. Olivia's She-shed Wish

We can't grant wishes without volunteers. Wish granting volunteers are trained community members who get the rewarding opportunity to meet with wish kids and their families to determine a child's one true wish. But in some counties, wish kids wait longer than others to meet with a wishgranting volunteer due to a volunteer shortage.

In the county where 8-year-old wish kid Olivia lives in rural southern Ohio, there are only a handful of trained volunteers. Volunteer Nicole Davis is one of them. She recruited friends and family to get trained to bring Olivia's wish for a she-shed to life as quickly as possible.

"Kids in this area wait a long time," said Davis.
"We need volunteers! It is super fun. Hearing what they want, writing it down, seeing it all come together, makes it all worth it."

Olivia wished for a she-shed so she could have a place all her own, a special space where she could rest and recharge after undergoing grueling chemotherapy for the past two-and-a-half-years.

"She's missed out on everything," said her mom. "She used to be a cheerleader. She used to play soccer, but she can't do those things anymore because of her weakened immune system."

Olivia designed her she-shed with her favorite colors and lots of unicorns. She couldn't stop smiling as she took her first step inside. "This is my new home!" she exclaimed. "I thought since trips you can only do one time, a she-shed you can have as a wish forever."

In her she-shed, Olivia can focus on just being a kid and look forward to life after leukemia—a wish come true!


