So here we are, reflecting on yet another year of wish granting in the great Garden State. But make no mistake, this wasn't just another year "in the books". This was a most special milestone year, our 35th anniversary, to be exact. And oh what a celebration it was, with record wish granting and revenue figures, you could say it was our biggest year ever!

As we look back on 2018, allow me to share with you how we measured these last 12 months:

- in 560 wishes being granted, 6th most of all MAW chapters in the country; in almost half of those visiting Mickey and Minnie in sunny Orlando, cruising on the high seas with Goofy or traveling to Disneyland to see how the magic is done there
- in trips to Abu Dhabi, Australia, England, Fiji, the Galapagos Islands, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Norway and still many more destinations...to visit ancient ruins, visit family never before seen, to witness the Northern Lights firsthand, ride the world's fastest roller coaster, to see where Darwin researched, and to visit the Great Barrier Reef, among other unique activities
- in dozens of computers, pools, swingsets, puppy dogs and shopping sprees... and in a private tryout with MLB scouts, in a model photoshoot in NYC, in a most special Quinceañera party, a recording studio, a camper and one very special Action Trackchair
- in meeting Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson, John Cena, Bruno Mars, P!nk, Aaron Judge, Eli Manning, Odell Beckham, Jr., Steph Curry, Kevin Hart and even the Pope, too, among so many more

• in receiving yet another 4 Star rating from Charity Navigator (one of the largest and well respected charity watchdog groups), their highest rating score for excellence in fiduciary stewardship and execution of our mission

And how to measure 35 years? One could offer by becoming one of the leading brands in the nonprofit space, to be sure. It could also be said that time has taught us, and our friends in the medical community, that we are more than just a "nice" thing for a child, more than merely a "warm and fuzzy" experience for them. Rather, as we've been told countless times that Make-A-Wish picks up where science and medicine leaves off, and that our mission provides for the child something that can be just as important, in fact essential, as their treatment protocol.

But my favorite measurement comes from the more than 10,000 life-changing wishes we have granted for children with critical illnesses in New Jersey since 1983. It gives me extra joy knowing that more than one-third of them have occurred in the last seven years since operating out of the Samuel & Josephine Plumeri Wishing Place, fondly called "the castle". And just as compelling, we've granted as many wishes in our last 10 years, as we did in our first 25!

But statistics such as these—and the good if not great news they represent—are not the most important message I mean to convey to you this holiday season and calendar year end. No, instead, it is this that no wish, be it in 1983 or 2018, would have been possible without YOU, without YOUR support! Much has changed in our world these last three and a half decades but this much hasn't—we still do not charge our families any fees, nor do we receive any government grants. Just as the founders in Arizona have done since 1980, and early stewards of MAWNJ have since 1983, today we still rely 100% on the generosity of the community to fuel our wish granting capabilities.

John F. Kennedy once said, "As we express our gratitude, we must never forget that the highest appreciation is not to utter words, but to live by them." My hope then is that you will accept the story behind the numbers, the figures I have shared with you here, and more...that you will accept them as proof that your precious gifts to our mission are a most powerful investment in helping to create life-changing wishes for children with critical illnesses in New Jersey. I would also hope that our extraordinary 35 year story–OUR story, together; donor and volunteer, medical partner and friend, board and staff; and most especially our wish families-has brought you a great and deep sense of fulfillment knowing you are a crucial part of this seemingly simple but oh-so powerful mission. We simply cannot do it without YOU.

In closing, I hope we can count on you again to continue bringing our special brand of magic to more inspiring children in 2019.

On behalf of the staff and the wish children we serve, my heartfelt wishes to you and your loved ones for a wonderful holiday season, and a healthy and prosperous New Year!



For nine-year-old Luca, when asked that simple but oh-so-powerful question, "if you could have one wish, what would it be?", Luca wished to meet his heroes—the New York Yankees. and that he would be joining the New York Yankees that very day at Yankee Stadium. Luca's shock was apparent and the excitement from his friends and classmates gathered around him was, too. When the video ended, Luca's entire school, who have supported him throughout his illness, lined the hallways and cheered him on with high fives and well wishes as he made his way through the main hallways and outside with his parents, where a limousine was waiting to take them to the stadium.

When they were done, Luca got to experience the indoor batting cages where he took batting practice. He was coached by the team's shortstop Didi Gregorious, who joked that he planned to give Luca tips, but after watching him at bat, didn't have much to say.

Everywhere he turned, members of the team could not wait to meet Luca. First baseman Tyler Austin showed him how to improve his grip, outfielder Brett Gardner asked to have a catch, and three-time MVP



For Luca, his wish day began just like any other school day. He got out of bed, had breakfast and threw on one of his favorite New York Yankees t-shirts and headed off to school. Luca had no idea that today would in fact not be like any other day—he was in for the surprise of a lifetime. While sitting in an assembly with his friends, a video began to play on the screen above the stage. The video was from Aaron Judge, an outfielder for the New York Yankees and one of Luca's favorite players. Judge had a surprise message for Luca. He began to tell him that his wish would be granted,



Hodgkin's lymphoma

"It's Hodgkin's lymphoma..."

Can you imagine hearing those words, knowing you have to tell your child it's cancer?

For most parents, it's unimaginable. For us, it became reality. And so, it began. Our otherwise healthy 15-year-old, who recently finished cross country season, was in the fight for her life. The diagnosis: Stage 4 Hodgkin's lymphoma.

It was hard to witness what she was going through. She was so sick, but she kept fighting and was determined. Exhausted and weak, just prior to one of her admissions, our social worker suggested that she might be a candidate for a "wish." I'll never forget how her face lit up at the prospect of having something to look forward to. It was the distraction and inspiration she needed to get through another round of chemo.

We talked at length about what she might want and that it was solely her choice what she wished for. Having this opportunity gave her back a sense of control since every other part of her life was dictated by cancer. What a tremendous gift.

The trip to Oahu, Hawaii was incredible not only because of its beauty but it gave us the time we needed to recover as a family. Veronica was told at the start of her treatment that we would never leave her alone and that we would pull each other through this, no matter what. Our trip represented a celebration, not only for her remission, but that we persevered, together, as a family.

People have recently said to me that Veronica is remarkably mature for her age. I tell them, cancer will do that to a kid. It changed her physically, mentally, and emotionally, as it did our family. It was such a painful and heart wrenching ordeal, yet it led us to people who graciously reached out and changed the trajectory of our lives.

Those of you at Make-A-Wish can never fully appreciate what your generosity means to us. When you are in crisis mode, it's almost impossible to look beyond the tragedy. Granting her a wish changed that, making it so difficult to articulate the impact of anticipation, excitement, hope, relief, and gratitude. Please know that we will always be grateful to all for making her wish come true!

The *fiesta de quince años* is a celebration of a girl's 15th birthday. The girl celebrating this special birthday is known as a *Quinceañera*, a term reserved solely for the honoree marking this special transition from childhood to young womanhood. This celebration embraces deep rooted customs and the virtues of family. It is traditional for the Quinceañera to choose special friends to participate in their special day and we were honored when Sharlin asked Make-A-Wish New Jersey to help grant her one true wish of a Quinceañera like one not seen before.

Once we received Sharlin's wish, our wish granters couldn't wait to begin. The first question...where to start? To help with that, Make-A-Wish New Jersey reached out to our dear friends at Goya. When they heard about Sharlin's wish, Goya jumped right in to help us with the planning.

How We Grant Wishes

On average, every day two families in New Jersey receive the devastating news that their child has been diagnosed with a critical illness. Their minds will be filled with questions, and their hearts filled with anxiety. They will begin a journey that will include constant doctor appointments, hospital stays, and medical treatments for their child.

That's where we come in. We pick up where science and medicine leave off, and we believe that wishes change the odds for children fighting critical illnesses. It's why we do what we do. Wishes can improve a child's quality of life, giving them a better chance of recovery.

Put simply, we believe a single wish transforms lives.

There are four steps to granting a wish. Each step builds on the next and

creates unforgettable experiences for wish kids and their families.

How We Grant Wishes

STEP 1 Referral

We rely on medical professionals, parents, family members and children themselves for referrals. Children who have been diagnosed with a qualifying critical illness and are currently in a life-threatening state, have reached the age of 2½ and are under the age of 18 at the time of referral, and have not received a wish from another wish-granting organization may be eligible for a wish.

STEP 2 Medical Eligibility

To receive a wish, the child must be diagnosed with a critical illness (i.e., a progressive, degenerative or malignant condition). The child's treating physician plays an integral role in determining the child's medical eligibility. Visit **md.wish.org** to learn what critical illnesses qualify for a wish.



STEP 3 The Wish

Our dedicated staff and volunteers meet with the child and their family to learn the child's one true wish. Our committed team members connect with our wish kids, awaken their imaginations and help them envision the seemingly impossible.



STEP 4 Creating Joy

Our staff and volunteer wish granters create an unforgettable experience driven by the child's creativity. They strive to personalize each wish and create life-long memories for not only the wish child, but the entire family.
