









President's Message

his autumn, we held several events. be it our Walk & Roll for Wishes at our home - the Samuel & Josephine Plumeri Wishing Place – fondly referred to as "the castle", or the one in Liberty State Park in Jersey City. There were also our annual wish family picnics, one again at the castle, and the other at The Funplex in Mt. Laurel. At these, and still other gatherings, we often invite wish families to 'share their story', if they'd like. Sometimes it's the wish child who speaks, other times a parent, grandparent, guardian or a sibling too may tell the story of how they came to receive a wish, and the impact of that wish on the child, family, and their community.

Listening to one such story recently, I was reminded of an old folk tale, one I shared at a past gala of ours. It goes like this -

There was an oil company that was looking to protect its inventory, quite simply its refinery property, strewn with oil tanks filled with their precious "black gold"...and they invested millions of dollars in state-of-the-art equipment to protect these tanks against a fire. Being situated in a small, sleepy town, a very rural area, the big oil company had little confidence in the local volunteer fire department, which was essentially made up of a mere four volunteers, all over 60 years old, and a tired, banged up fire truck.

The plant spent hundreds of thousands of dollars more on training an elite ALPHA team to put down any fire should one occur. And, lo and behold, sure enough the day came that they would be tested - a fire broke out in one of the tanks and quickly swept through the entire tank farm. The ALPHA team and state-of-the-art equipment they had was no match, so the management called for all employees to evacuate the plant immediately.

As they all stood quietly, and helplessly watched the company's entire inventory burning to the ground, they heard the sound of a fire truck coming over the hill in the far-off distance. Could it be? No way! But sure enough, yes it was, here were the volunteer firefighters from the local town, coming with their tired, banged up old dingy fire truck. As it came down the hill it gained more momentum, and started to increase its speed dramatically, heading straight for

One could see the look of fear on the volunteer firefighters' faces as they raced by, and although the plant personnel attempted to signal the driver to stop as it was obviously a futile effort because even the plant's A-team was no match, the volunteer firefighters charged right through and were soon right in the center of the tanks that were now burning out of control.

Then, suddenly, like a precision drill team, each man and woman jumped out of the truck and began hosing each other and their truck with their own water. Then, they turned their hose on the nearest tank. Incredibly, they put the fire out, and then they turned to the next tank, and the next, until, unbelievably, miraculously, they had put out all the fires!

Well of course there was a great "HOORAY" shouted out by the plant employees as they ran with the volunteers on their shoulders, parading them through the downtown into the public square for all the people to see, and to thank their new heroes. Then the Chairman of the big oil company decided to write these volunteer firefighters a generous donation for their heroic deed, right there on the spot. Upon presenting the captain of the team with his check, he asked him, "So Captain, you saved the plant, you saved hundreds of jobs for everyone, you escaped unscathed - tell us, what are you and your team going to do with this reward money?"

The Captain looked at the check, then looked at the crowd gathered around,

looked back at the oil Chairman and said, "Well the first thing we're gonna do is FIX THE BRAKES on that darn old fire truck!" ©

Yes, I should have mentioned its also a funny tale, and brought great laughter at that gala. But far more importantly, it's not meant to be analogous per se, necessarily, but this little anecdote does remind me a lot about what we witness each day at Make-A-Wish.

The wish children and their families are placed into situations that, at times, they have little or no control over, but as we have seen thousands of times, they and their families act heroically, they do the best they can, they stick together, they maintain hope.

And so too, all of you reading this, by supporting the powerful mission that is Make-A-Wish, you are much like the volunteer firefighters who saw the unsettling dilemma in front of them, but rather than looking the other way, decided to roll up your sleeves, and get involved, and help bring the power of a wish to a deserving child. For this, we are forever grateful.

I'd like to close by sharing one wish mom's thoughts that she shared at one of our events recently. Jennifer is Austin's mom, who along with her husband, Ryan, help Austin battle MPS Type 1 Hurler syndrome, a rare genetic disease. We granted Austin's wish back in 2010, when he was five years old, to go to Disney. Jennifer told the audience,

"Wishes matter and Make-A-Wish matters." We've seen over our time involved in Make-A-Wish that wishes inspire. Kids get wishes and it pushes them to do something or be something in the future. And that's awesome. We've seen wishes that give people the power to fight when they're tired. I'm here to talk about the wishes that come when there is no hope. Make-A-Wish says, "It's okay. We're not doing this so that you can be something someday, we're not doing this so that you can give back to us

and we're not doing this so that you can change the world. We're doing this because joy matters. Right now, right where you are, not because of what you'll be, but because of who and where you are right now, and that joy matters."

They are respectful of siblings. They say, 'We see you guys, we see how hard it is, and it's okay, you deserve this moment of fun too because we know how hard it is to watch your sibling battle!' They see parents and caregivers and they say, 'We see you and we see that it's hard and you're fighting, and it's okay. We've got this one. We've got this. You just enjoy it, you just be in the moment.' That matters. That's changed the way we've lived our lives!"

In this season of giving thanks, we are deeply grateful to wish moms like Jennifer, and wish dads, guardians and all caregivers, for trusting us to bring our special mission into your child's life, and your families' lives.

We're grateful to our donors and volunteers statewide who put the fuel in our tanks and provide additional hands for carrying our mission to more children and families each year.

We're grateful to our medical partners who trust us with their patients, and who recognized long ago that Make-A-Wish picks up where science and medicine leave off.

Lastly, I must express my gratitude to the staff and board of Make-A-Wish New Jersey, all of whom have been making me proud for the last 15 years, with their extraordinary talents and impact. But this year in particular, our colleagues at our national office saw their extraordinary efforts too and recently at our annual conference in October presented our chapter with one of our organization's highest honors, the Power of One Award, which is effectively "Chapter of the Year". We are all humbled by this and assure you we'll continue to work hard to advance our seemingly simple but oh so powerful mission daily.

Austin's mom Jennifer was right. "We got this!"



Officer Riley Reports for Duty!

I wish to be a Las Vegas Metropolitan police officer

Riley has had a desire to be in law enforcement for as long as he can remember. His love of police and first responders began in early childhood when he struck up a friendly relationship with his local police department. He has even dressed up as a different member of law enforcement every Halloween, wishing for this to be his everyday life.

In the summer of 2012, Riley started having seizures and displaying signs of an extreme form of epilepsy. As the years passed, Riley's doctors administered different medications and performed surgeries to relieve the symptoms, but the seizures continued.

After much consideration, Riley underwent a risky brain surgery that succeeded in eliminating his seizures but resulted in paralysis on the left side of his body. Even then, police were by Riley's side – especially his close friend, Lieutenant Michael Packer of the Westville Police Department, who escorted him to and from the hospital.

Finally seizure-free, Riley was forced to relearn simple life tasks, from walking to showering, to lifting his arms above his head. Despite these obstacles, he was determined to get his strength up. Almost one year after his surgery, Riley walked out of the hospital, proving to everyone that he was ready to travel for his one true wish.

After watching the news coverage of the devastating events of 1 October in Las Vegas, Riley was inspired by the efforts of the Las Vegas Metropolitan police officers who fought to save lives that day. He wished to join the men and women in blue in Las Vegas on the anniversary of 1 October to meet and work alongside his heroes.

On the day of his wish, Riley prepared to leave for the airport, unaware of the surprises that were in store for him. When he opened his front door, he was met with the applause of an honor guard of local and state police departments from New Jersey and Pennsylvania. As the police motorcade escorted him to the airport, his journey as a police officer was finally beginning to unfold.

When he arrived at the airport in Las Vegas, Riley was welcomed by more heroes— the LVMPD and the Northwest Area Command. Not long after, he donned his utility belt and dove straight into basic defensive training with Sheriff Joe Lombardo, the SWAT team, Air, K-9 and Motor Units.

With a wealth of newly acquired skills, Officer Riley put on his official uniform and graduated from the training academy. Now an "official" officer, Riley attended a briefing and went out on his first training call, applying everything he learned that day to the scene of a crime.

Riley ended the day by meeting another hero, Officer Brady Cook who was wounded responding to 1 October, on his first shift as a police officer. During their conversation, Riley got an in-depth look at what it truly means to protect and serve.

A day on the job as a police officer came naturally to Riley. Destined for a career in helping others, he hopes to one day follow in their footsteps, pursuing a career in cybersecurity.

A Heartfelt Letter from Matthew's Mom, Sarah

"Can you imagine having a child with 80-90 seizures a month throughout most of infancy?

Our son Matthew seemed to be healthy the first three months of his life. There were no signs that he was born with a genetic condition called Dravet Syndrome until his very first seizure in August of 2016. He was a tiny baby, and to witness his body stiffen and change color was terrifying! We rushed him to the hospital and ran many tests before it was discovered that Matthew has a drug-resistant form of epilepsy.

Today, at three years old, we are miraculously seeing far less seizures, usually occurring in the teens, and this gives us an opportunity to focus on getting him physically stronger! When asked what wish Matthew wished for, my husband and I had to think long and hard. Due to his condition, Matthew has significant developmental delays. He is nonverbal and unable to voice his wants and needs. We wanted Matthew's wish to be something on Matthew's behalf that would be beneficial to him long-term.

We thought it would be a neat idea to turn our garage into a sensory playroom and gym for Matthew. This amazing sensory playroom allows for us to invite in his therapists so that Matthew can receive PT, OT, and speech therapy in the comforts of our home. Matthew receives seven therapies throughout the week, so it has been nice to also use the garage as his therapy room. Make-A-Wish brought in professionals to refinish the garage floor, paint the walls, and volunteers came together to build a warm and inviting environment with a "forest animals" theme for our son.

When Matthew is not working with the therapists, my husband and I love to read him books under the canopy or play with the jumbo blocks which were also gifted to him. He really enjoys watching the fish moving inside the sensory fish tank and playing with the colorful balls inside the ball pit. Make-A-Wish graciously turned an unusable part of our house into a space that Matthew utilizes every single day!

Through Matthew's condition, we have realized just how many amazing people are out there to look after him! Thank you to the wonderful team at Make-A-Wish for positively changing the lives of children like Matthew. Our family is extremely grateful that an organization like Make-A-Wish exists to brighten up the lives of each warrior fighting an illness.

We are also very thankful to all the therapists and doctors who work arduously to make Matthew better and stronger each day, and our Grace Community Chapel community for being with us each and every step of the way on this journey. Even during this season of our lives we count our blessings and we know that God has hand-picked all these specific individuals to help us get through this time."

We believe that a wish serves as a catalyst for renewed strength and encouragement for every child and family on their journey, and can improve a child's quality of life. One of the greatest testaments to these beliefs is that the majority of our referrals come from the medical community themselves. Doctors, nurses, social workers and child life specialists share with us nearly daily the impact a wish has on their patients, and that gives us continued inspiration to reach more eligible children every year. But we cannot do it without our friends in the medical community. **Every wish begins with a referral**. Thank you to our referral sources – you are at the starting line of a wish experience!



There are four steps to granting a wish. Each step builds on the next and creates unforgettable experiences for wish kids and their families.

★ STEP 1 The Referral

We rely on medical professionals, parents, family members and children themselves for referrals. Children who have been diagnosed with a qualifying critical illness and are currently in a life-threatening state, have reached the age of 2½ and are under the age of 18 at the time of referral, and have not received a wish from another wish-granting organization may be eligible for a wish.

* STEP 2 | Medical Eligibility

The child's treating physician plays an integral role in determining the child's medical eligibility. Visit md.wish.org to learn what critical illnesses qualify for a wish.

* STEP 3 The Wish

Our dedicated staff and volunteers meet with the child and their family to learn the child's one true wish. They connect with our wish kids, awaken their imaginations and help them envision the seemingly impossible.

★ STEP 4 Creating Joy

Our staff and volunteer wish granters create an unforgettable experience driven by the child's creativity. They strive to personalize each wish and create life-long memories for not only the wish child, but the entire family.






