

# President's Message

As we approach a new year, with renewed hope and optimism on the horizon, we leave behind a most challenging 2020. As you consider the many worthy causes to support with a year-end gift, my hope is that you'll consider supporting us again before the year is out.

Perhaps it was stories like Bethany's that prompted your gift in past years. Trust that we've been granting wishes throughout this pandemic, because we cannot cancel hope!

Bethany, age 11, and battling Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia (A.L.L.) had a wish to go to the Bahamas (pre Covid), what she called "the most beautiful place on earth".

Upon returning from their trip, Bethany's dad, Jim, called and told me all about how wonderful she looked and was feeling, smiling like the kid he remembered her to be before her illness. Then he asked, "How were you able to send my family on this trip, one that my wife and I could never have given Bethany and our family?"

I explained, "Donors care about a child and family such as yours. The reasons why they donate may vary, just as varied as "who" gives, as support comes from all types of sources each year." There are many people - and businesses - who contribute, and many ways to do so.

Jim seemed satisfied with my reply, and he closed the conversation with, "You've given me a lot to think about."

Later that night I received the following email from Jim:

"I feel it important to share the impact of the wish experience on my family. It was exactly what Bethany needed, and, for a marriage that has been challenged over the last two years, and for two siblings who have not had a vacation trip in more than 7 years. We feel like our batteries are re-charged! All we cared about was Bethany, but one day, sitting on the beach she said, 'For my wish, I just wanted to give you all something we could share and enjoy. Thank you for all you do for me.'

My wife and I were in tears, and my two daughters jumped into the water to cover theirs.

I used to think that we live in a rather cynical society, however, my little girl's experience has taught me many things and has humbled my wife and me, but mostly, it has challenged me to think differently. How could I continue to think that I live in a cynical society when you tell me that complete strangers helped my little girl, and our family, to do something that we otherwise would not have been able to do, during a time that was so painful and difficult for us? What does THAT say about a society, that donors to Make-A-Wish circle the wagons around my little Bethany? Cynical? No way! Humbling, giving, selfless, generous, caring? OH YES!"

If I've learned anything in my three decades in the nonprofit sector, almost two of those here at MAWNJ, it is this – people are often seeking deeper meaning in their lives. Isn't it part of the human condition then that we gravitate towards meaningful experiences in life, truly meaningful and powerful? I think so.

I can't think of many that are more powerful than helping bring hope and joy to a child and family who are facing a life-threatening illness! To see the world, to see life through their eyes, to be made aware of mortality – theirs and our own - is deeply humbling and profound. It can offer incredibly powerful perspective for our own lives.

Meaningful experiences change us. More and more meaningful experiences change us, more and more.

Continuing To Deliver Joy In A Year Unlike Any Other\*

In early March, just days before we would enter a state-wide lockdown due to the spread of the COVID-19 virus, one of the very last wishes for 2020 that would involve travel and a large gathering for any of our wish kids was granted to a Jersey City teen named Antonio.

From a young age, Antonio had set his sights on attending Duke University and becoming a member of their elite Blue Devils basketball team. Even a diagnosis of a brain tumor was not going to get in the way of that dream. When Antonio was asked to declare his wish, he knew immediately that it would be to see his Duke University Blue Devils in action,

at a home game, taking on their historic rivals, the University of North Carolina Tar Heels.

Antonio's life-changing weekend at Duke University would include being the guest of honor at the team meeting prior to the big game, and a one-of-a-kind cherished moment – meeting Coach K himself and joining him in escorting the team into the arena by Coach K's side. Antonio's wish also included a powerful moment that all those in attendance will never forget, a crowd of 9,000 fans in the arena cheering Antonio's name as the team encircled him at center court to present him with the game ball following their win.

Fast forward from the moment of Antonio's wish, to wish-granting amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. As a team, we immediately began to find ways to pivot and continue bringing that same level of excitement and joy to other wish kids. One example - 10-year-old Neil of Bernardsville, who was born with a genetic condition, MECP2 Duplication Syndrome, and diagnosed with Moyamoya Disease a few years later.

Neil's medical condition has left him severely disabled and medically fragile, and his family found it harder and harder to safely move him from his wheelchair to a swing – his favorite thing to do, while watching the cars drive by in front of his home. Neil's wish was for a new, state-of-the-art swing that could accommodate him, while still in his wheelchair.

Once the swing was installed, we partnered with first responders from Bernardsville and surrounding communities, and delivered a surprise convoy of police cars, fire trucks, motorcycles and neighbors – over 200 vehicles - who drove past, holding up signs and cheering. Neil's family shared that there are very few things in life that bring Neil joy – but that day, joy was certainly delivered.







# Looking Back On 2020






