Teen 'Wishes' to Provide Gaming Systems to Children's Mercy Patients through Make-A-Wish Missouri & Kansas

Kansas City, MO (July 22, 2021) For 18-year-old Trenton Elliot, playing video games with friends while he was in the hospital was an opportunity to forget about his medical condition and focus on just being a regular kid. It's something most children can do at any time, but for Trenton, who suffers from cystic fibrosis and has spent a lot of time at Children's Mercy Kansas City over the years, it was an activity that had to be scheduled due to the limited number of gaming systems available. So, when it was time for him to choose his one true wish, he decided to give back to the hospital where he was treated and allow children like him to feel the same relief through playing video games.

"I wanted to be sure there were enough gaming systems so that children in the hospital could all play together," said Elliot. "It's better to play with friends than it is to play alone and it helps kids take their minds off of the illness or injury they are battling and just be a kid for a while."

On Thursday, July 22 at 12:00 p.m. outside the Children's Mercy Research Institute building, Trenton and his family will arrive via limousine to be greeted by supporters and hospital staff, where Trenton will be presented with five Xbox Series X and five PlayStation 5 gaming systems to deliver to the hospital. On top of the gaming systems provided, Gamers Outreach, a nonprofit that empowers hospitalized families through play, is also involved. "When we heard about Trenton's wish we knew immediately we wanted to be involved. I reached out to one of our supporters Anthony Kongphan who, together with his community, recently funded a set of GO Karts. Anthony was moved by the story and graciously offered to donate one of his GO Karts to fulfill the wish", said Dave Fraser, Director of Development at Gamers Outreach. GO Karts are portable gaming kiosks built specifically for hospitals that provide access to play for patients and families. Inclusivity was crucial to Trenton, and he made sure to select video games that would be appropriate for all ages and genders so that everyone could participate in playing the games.

"There are so many things Trenton could have done with this 'wish' for himself, but instead he chose to put others first and help brighten their days," said Children Mercy representative Micaela McKenna. "He loves gaming and this wish allows him to share his passion and leave a lasting impact on the lives of other children."

Ambassadors from Children's Mercy, Make-A-Wish staff, Trenton's family, and an ambassador family from Children's Mercy will attend the wish event and will speak about the impact of Trenton's wish to give back.

Make-A-Wish Missouri & Kansas hopes to grant 333 life-changing wishes such as Trenton's this year and looks to surpass its 9,000th wish this summer.
