Madison County boy's playset wish comes true

Make-A-Wish® Central New York grants 9-year-old Collin's wish thanks to the generous support of Bristol Myers Squibb

In 2019, Collin quickly went from his happy, playful self, to feeling fatigued, achy, and feverish. Over the course of one weekend, he developed symptoms that worried his family.

"He was so tired and sick he was unable to walk," recalled Collin's grandmother, Victoria Durant. "We knew something was seriously wrong. When we took him to the hospital, we had to pick him up and carry him to the van."

After visiting a local healthcare center, bloodwork results pointed to a serious condition. Collin was referred to Upstate University Hospital in Syracuse, where physicians confirmed his diagnosis: b-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia. Collin would need to begin treatment immediately.

"When he was admitted, we scrambled to get what we needed," Durant said. "We ended up staying there a month."

Since then, Collin has received ongoing treatment, including chemotherapy, which he'll need for a total of three years. During treatment, Collin's doctors referred him to Make-A-Wish Central New York for a once-in-a-lifetime wish.

"When we found out he was approved for a wish, all I did was cry," Durant said. "But they were happy tears!"

As Collin thought about what he would want, he insisted it be something he could enjoy with his four siblings. Ultimately, he decided on a backyard playset.

On Wednesday, July 28, 2021, Make-A-Wish Central New York surprised Collin with his wish-cometrue - a white cedar playset by Bears Playground featuring two slides, a bridge, a climbing wall and climbing net with lots of room for family and friends!

"It's wonderful," Durant said of the playset. "This will keep him busy for a long, long time!"
