After being diagnosed with wilms tumor, a type of kidney cancer, four-year-old Carmen was sent into a world of treatments and remedies and was unable to continue her life at preschool surrounded by constant learning, friends, and activities.

"She is so fun, fiery, smart, brave, funny, and empathetic" said Leslie, Carmen's mom.

While her life at school was taken away, she continued to fight through her treatments and maintained a positive attitude. She absolutely loved watching the Frozen movies during her treatments and even now after treatment, she still loves to

dress up and act out the movies with her parents.

As Carmen approached the end of her treatment, the COVID-19

pandemic hit. Unfortunately, this meant that while she should have been free to enjoy the world around her, Carmen had to remain isolated out of precaution, which meant she spent even more time away from the life she knew before treatment. She had to find new ways to keep herself healthy and entertained, and that is exactly where her wish came in.

Originally, Carmen had wished to go to Walt Disney World® but out of precaution, she chose to change her wish so that she could have a more immediate, positive addition in her life. While her family

thought Disney was her ultimate wish, they did not realize that her new wish, a play structure in the backyard, would be even greater than they could have imagined. This new play structure ensured that Carmen could go outside daily, enjoy the fresh air, and be safe.

"Carmen changed her wish to a play structure and honestly, I think this was the best wish she could have," said Leslie. "Her play structure was a HUGE mood booster for her, and she has played on it every day since it was set up for her –minus the snow days."

On the day of her wish, Cinderella came by to pay Carmen a special visit and this made her the happiest girl in the world. She felt incredibly special hanging out with one of her favorite princesses.

However, he has been greatly motivated by his wish to have his very own gaming system. When his play station was

delivered on the day of his wish reveal, it was a great reminder that he needed to keep persevering throughout his recovery. For Isaac, the play station was a way to not only entertain himself, but more importantly, it was a way to connect with his friends who he had not seen in months due to his surgery and the pandemic. Being able to play with his friends reminds him to continue practicing his new skills, ensuring that one day he will be able to be a normal kid again. In addition to his wish, Isaac also remains inspired by the monthly gifts he

Going to Hawaii was a unique experience for Paige and it gave her the ability to relax, be outside, and remember what it is like to truly be a teenager. It left a great impact on her life and encouraged her to tell everyone she knew

about Make-A-Wish and the incredible wish she had received. Looking back on her time in Hawaii, she said, "Knowing I was that ill and had a chance to do that made me appreciate life that much more. Looking back on photos makes me smile for the experiences I had

At the age of 12, I heard the devastating news that I was living with non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma.

My condition became the focal point of our lives and demanded everyone's attention. From diagnosis to the time spent fighting this cancer, I did not look or feel like myself. Most importantly, I was immunosuppressed and felt disconnected from the world as I was unable to participate in normal activities without fear of getting sick.

My wish was for a laptop computer. My wish for a laptop was very special because it allowed me to stay connected with my friends through social media and engage in fun activities that didn't put myself at risk, including computer

My wish has impacted my life to this day. A few years after I completed treatment, I began volunteering for Make-A-Wish. I continue to participate in the annual Radiothon, I'm an airport greeter and just this year, I joined the Make-A-Wish Nebraska Board of Directors. My time spent in the hospital also created the desire to become a physician. I am currently a medical student at the University of Nebraska Medical Center and about to begin an anesthesiology residency.

A wish is something that my family and I are extremely thankful for! There aren't a lot of bright spots when a wish kid is going through treatments, but Make-A-Wish is one of those bright spots. Thanks for making wishes come true!
