President's Message

Dear Friends,

A friend recently suggested a good read for me, Shelter From The Storm: Caring for a Child with a Life-threatening Condition. In it, author Dr. Joanne Hilden explains the dynamics that often occur within a family that has such a special child... families such as the ones we at Make-A-Wish meet on an almost daily basis.

Dr. Hilden writes to parents, "You are trying to care for [your child] at the same time that you are dealing with your own emotions Everyone involved will be going through a time of emotional, spiritual, psychological, and physical struggle Suddenly doctors and nurses are in control of so much of your child's life. But remember that your parental instincts have served you well in the past and will continue to do so. Your role as your child's guardian and protector has not been taken away; it is only being partially shared by experts in health care." Dr. Hilden goes on to use the phrase the "Care Team", which is essentially the combination of family members and health care professionals who are caring for the child. And at times, this includes extended family, friends, and neighbors too.

I think Dr. Hilden would agree that when we come into the lives of children and their families who are facing life-threatening medical conditions, that we are members of the Care Team as we've been told for now over 40 years that a wish can bring a profound impact on the child's, and their family's, well-being. By virtue of your support, YOU too are on this very special team, as well!

In fact, sometimes it's not "who" but "what" makes an impact from a care team perspective. Case in point, consider Cody's wish story that was recently featured on Sunday TODAY with Willie Geist –

"In 2018, a boy with a rare condition that prevented him from walking or talking met a horse that changed his life, and many others. When Cody Dorman was born with Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome, doctors told his parents he likely would live for only two years. But he was twelve when the Make-A-Wish Foundation brought Cody and his family to Gainsborough Farm near Lexington, Kentucky to meet a gentle six-month-old

horse. With Cody in his wheelchair, the foal walked right over and put his head in Cody's lap. The two became fast friends, and the horse's owners named him Cody's Wish.

Cody became a regular at the track as his buddy won race after race, including last year's Dirt Mile at the prestigious Breeders' Cup.

"Here's the wire, the wish has come true! That one's for you, Cody! Cody's Wish has won the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile!"

Then just last weekend, Cody's Wish was back in the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita Park in California. for his final

race before retiring. In a moment almost too dramatic to be real, the horse came from last place to beat the Preakness champion by a nose.

"Cody's Wish takes the lead! I think he won it by a nose on the wire over National Treasure! Thank you, Cody, and thank you Cody's Wish!"

Cody was waiting for his friend in the Winner's Circle. The next day, Cody passed away.

In a statement, mom and dad said, "We always knew this day would come, but we were determined to help Cody live his best life for however long we had him."

Burkitt's lymphoma

Jonah was diagnosed with Burkitt's lymphoma when he was just five years old, after receiving surgery for an enlarged lymph node on his neck.

"We were shocked and devastated as we tried to navigate what the next steps would be," his mom Becky shared.

Early detection gave Jonah a good prognosis, though with a cancer diagnosis, he would still need to undergo a grueling treatment process.

"For three months he had to endure weekly chemo, hair loss, a rare infection, an extended hospital stay and 15 doses of medication a day at home. It was a traumatic experience for our whole family," Becky continued.

"Even now that he is considered cured, we are still dealing with the psychological and behavioral impacts that Jonah struggles with and how they impact his twin sister and eight-year-old brother."

Jonah's cancer diagnosis and treatment took away many aspects of a normal childhood, including going outside and playing and hiking.

"He has always particularly loved trees," Becky shared. "I had told him from a young age that someday we would go see the really big trees in California."

When Make-A-Wish entered Jonah's life, he knew just what to wish for - to see those big sequoia trees out West.

During Jonah's wish, his family found themselves in the center of Sequoia National Park, basking in the resilience of trees that had been around for thousands of years – a resilience not unlike that of their brave six-year-old.

"It was so heartwarming to see him doing what he loves again after so many months of being sick and having to get his strength back," Becky reflected. "We had an amazing time hiking, going inside the trees, horseback riding and even seeing a bear! Jonah was delighted and was so proud to become a Junior Ranger at the park. He kept telling everyone with a big smile that he was the reason we got to go on this trip! Jonah's wish absolutely made a life-changing difference to our family. It has given us a new focal point for this painful year and provided an opportunity for us to begin healing and reconnecting as a family. Though we are still navigating his emotional healing from this ordeal, the memories we made on the trip serve as a reminder that we can have great experiences as a family even when things are tough and that the kindness of strangers can change everything."



A Royal Ball Fit For Princess Andi

Imagine receiving news that your child has a critical illness, a rare genetic disorder known as ataxiatelangiectasia, that will slowly rob them of neuromuscular control, yet their cognitive abilities will remain untouched. For Andi's family, this news brought unimaginable heartbreak and a fierce determination to keep Andi as mobile as

possible, for as long as

possible.

"When we first found out, it was easily the worst day of our lives," shared Lauren, Andi's mom. "It broke our hearts in ways we can never explain. After taking the time to grieve the life we thought Andi would have, we pivoted to celebrating all that Andi can do. Her doctors have told us that she will lose her ability to walk around age ten, and her life expectancy is anywhere from 19 to 25 years of age. But we are doing everything within our power to push these limits so that she is with us for much longer."

When Andi declared her wish to go to the Walt Disney World® Resort and meet her favorite Disney Princess Ariel, she had no idea just how much Disney magic awaited her. To their surprise, Andi and her family would be one of 50 wish families invited to Disney's "Once Upon A Wish Party", a special event that was a fairytale come to life, complete with a Royal Ball for Disney princesses and princes.

"To have an entire Royal Ball with every princess was so beyond Andi's

wildest dreams," Lauren shared. "We truly didn't know that anything like that was even possible, but Make-A-Wish and Disney made

it happen!"

From the moment the family arrived,
Disney cast members and

volunteers greeted them and proclaimed Andi as royalty. After breakfast, the heart of Andi's wish came true – a meet and greet not only with her favorite princess Ariel, but with actress Halle Bailey who portrays Ariel in Disney's live-action

The Little Mermaid. And the surprises kept coming

- Elsa, Anna and Olaf from
Disney's *Frozen* gave Andi and her
sister Brynn royal lessons, teaching them
how to curtsy and dance, and Andi was
gifted a Princess Ariel costume, crown,

sash and magic wand to wear to the Royal Ball the following night.

At the Royal Ball, Andi's joy and confidence shined through as she posed for pictures in her costume and danced the night away with more than 30 Disney princesses and characters.

"It was really special to be there with other wish families who were going through similar journeys," Lauren recalled. "These little warriors were not sick and tired, they were dancing around thoroughly living their dreams in the happiest place on Earth. The memories and photos we have from that day are truly family treasures for us and will be something we can reflect on during future difficult times as Andi's condition progresses. It was really special that we

got to go on this trip before Andi

is wheelchair bound, so that

she could walk up to meet
her dream princesses
and feel like the most
special little girl.
This trip more than
restored our hope,
strength, and joy to

our family."

Andi's wish was more than a vacation or a party - it was a testament to her resilience, a celebration of her life and proof of the unwavering support of those who help to make wishes come true.

When he was just five years old, Leam's parents heard those devastating, life-altering words – your child has cancer. Life took a turn and the future seemed unrecognizable. Hopes and dreams they once envisioned for their young son changed to facing life one day at a time, learning more about Leam's diagnosis, the treatment protocols and focusing on maintaining a positive outlook while they navigated the terrifying unknowns.

"You never think it's going to be your child,"
Leam's mom Sina shared. "We were robbed of a lot of
things. It feels like just yesterday, being told that they found a
mass in his chest. It was devastating, it shook our world. But
he went through it so gracefully, I do not know how else to
describe it. He is a special kid."

Leam has always loved turtles and often thought about the day he'd finally see the majestic creatures, known as Honu, up close and personal. After a long and difficult battle, Leam knew that a trip to Hawaii – for not only him, but for his entire family – was his one true wish.

On a warm spring day in Manalapan, New Jersey, nine-year old Leam pulled up in a limousine to The Learning Experience, thinking he was participating in an activity for kids who recently declared their wish. Little did he know that The Learning Experience was amidst its nationwide annual "Let's Grant Wishes!" campaign that has raised over \$4 million for Make-A-Wish across the country, and that his wish was about to be granted.

The Learning Experience and Make-A-Wish surprised Leam with a tropical celebration in his honor and shared the news that his wish to go to Hawaii and meet the sea turtles

was granted, and he was headed for the Aloha

State in just one week. The celebration included Hawaiian dancers, fire breathers, Kona Ice and some Jersey Shore turtles.

The weeklong adventure was everything
Leam and his family had hoped for and more.
From the beautiful beaches, to enjoying local
cuisine, to snorkeling on the North Shore, taking
a submarine ride and of course, a sea turtle tour,

Leam was able to be a kid again, and make lifelong memories with his family.

"It wasn't just a simple getaway from work and school, it was celebrating his life," Sina shared. "That's what made it so much more epic. And the culture of Hawaii – it's not just in your head, it's really all around you. It was a good place to heal. Hawaii's culture and the nature around us was therapeutic, it was good medicine."

This July, 18-year-old Judah experienced the surprise of a lifetime, when his wish for a Kubota Tractor was granted during a celebration at the Samuel & Josephine Plumeri Wishing Place with Make-A-Wish staff, alumni, volunteers and supporters of our mission.

Judah's wish marked a historic milestone for Make-A-Wish New Jersey, as the 12,000th wish granted since our chapter's founding in 1983. The 4th of July themed event engaged the community in a day filled with games, food trucks, ice cream and a celebration of our impactful mission.

Judah courageously battles thalassemia, a life-threatening genetic blood disorder. He lives on a farm where he hopes to cultivate and grow all sorts of vegetables on his own. Judah's Tractor-Loader-Backhoe is known for its versatility and will be ideal for the many different projects Judah intends to use it for. He also is now able to



keep up with his brothers on the farm, something he has struggled with his entire life due to his medical condition.

Due to Judah's diagnosis, his parents Jennie and Ron shared that he does not often talk about the future. Since the granting of his wish, they shared how happy they are to see Judah filled with hope for the first time in his life, and that his wish is the reason for that new-found hope.

"You always want your children to have hope," Judah's dad Ron reflected. "We can want the best for our children, but unless they want that too – he is the one that has to put the effort into the hope, he's the one that has to stay with it every day. To finally see him starting to step out of "the end" and into "what can be" thanks to Make-A-Wish is definitely a blessing." *

STEP 1 Referral

We rely on medical professionals, parents, family members and children themselves for referrals.

STEP 2 **Medical Eligibility**

Children who have been diagnosed with a qualifying critical illness, and are between the ages of 21/2 and 18 at the time of the referral, may be eligible for a wish.

STEP 3 Wish Discovery

Our dedicated staff and volunteers meet with the child and their family. They awaken the child's imagination to envision the seemingly impossible.

We create an unforgettable and personalized experience driven by the child's creativity to create lifelong memories for the entire wish family.






