




WISH KID SPOTLIGHT

Keegan was three months old when he started watching his cousins play hockey. He was three years old when he first started skating. And three years old when he received a diagnosis that changed everything.

It was the day after Thanksgiving in 2018 when he came down with what was thought to be an ear infection and fever. He was on antibiotics, but that didn't help. He lost his appetite and stopped eating and drinking. On November 27, 2018, he was taken to the emergency room. The emergency room doctor came in, took one look at him, and knew something was very wrong.

After running more tests, he was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia.

Keegan received chemotherapy treatment for over three years. He had two surgeries, to insert and remove his port. His family had to be very cautious of who he was around, as any fever would lead to an ER trip and potential hospital admission. Instead of focusing on just being a kid, he was denied the opportunity to participate in group activities or sports for years.

When his parents were told Keegan, now 7, qualified for a wish from Make-A-Wish[®] Michigan, they were excited! For all that he had been through, he deserved something special. Keegan's wish to have a backyard ice rink made everything come full circle.

When the rink arrived, he was one happy boy! Gone was the stress, they had a reprieve from thinking nonstop about cancer. Instead, they were able to witness their son get excited about something he was passionate about.
