Wish Granting Steps

We have an ambitious vision — to grant the wish of every eligible child in San Diego and Imperial Counties. We believe that wishes change the odds for children fighting critical illnesses; it's why we do what we do. Wishes have the ability to help kids envision life beyond their medical conditions, decrease a family's anxiety, and bring entire communities together.



Referral



We rely on medical professionals, parents, and children themselves for referrals. A child with a critical illness over the age of 2 ½ and vounger than 18 at the time of referral is potentially eligible for a wish

Medical Eligibility

To be eligible for a wish, the child must be diagnosed with a critical illness that is currently placing their life in jeopardy.



The Wish

Our dedicated wish- granting volunteers meet with the child, and their family, to help determine the essence of the child's wish.

The Power of A Wish:

Nearly four decades after the San Diego chapter of the Make-A-Wish Foundation was established on December 21, 1983, the organization's singular focus has remained the same — to make a difference in the lives of children dealing with critical illnesses. Make-A-Wish began as a volunteer-run organization that relied on the community to make each child's wish a reality. Almost 40 years later, Make-A-Wish San Diego continues to bring the community together to grant every wish without delay.

December 21, 1983: **Make-A-Wish Foundation** of San Diego was founded

In 1982, a news segment aired about a group of volunteers in Arizona who were granting wishes for children with critical illnesses. The story highlighted Chris Greicius' wish to be an Arizona State Trooper, which inspired the founding of the organization, and Bopsy Salazar, the first official wish kid, who wished to be a firefighter. San Diego mother and elementary school teacher, Jaime Tucker was so inspired by the story that she made it her mission to bring the power of a wish to children with critical illnesses to her community. She gathered friends and supporters, many of whom were also working mothers, and started the long and challenging process of creating an affiliate chapter. These dedicated volunteers met regularly in Jamie's living room and were committed to raising funds and rallying the community to make it possible to serve children in our area. A year after they began this important work, the Make-A-Wish Foundation of San Diego, Inc. was officially founded on December 21st, 1983 as the 33rd chapter of Make-A-Wish.

Milestone Wish Hosted by the San Diego Padres



In 2012, the San Diego Padres hosted the granting of Make-A-Wish San Diego's 3000th wish. 15-year-old Khadji, who was battling a nervous system disorder, thought he was there to throw out the first pitch but soon learned that his wish to have a basketball court in his backyard had been granted. A timelapse video of the court being constructed in his backyard was played on the jumbotron in front of a cheering crowd. "This is a life-changing experience for us," shared Khadji's dad Robert. "Just the prospect of having his wish granted has boosted Khadji's self-esteem and helped our entire family. We are blessed to have Make-A-Wish playing a part in our lives ... it makes you feel like you're not alone in this."

Cai longed to get back outdoors with his family and decided a camping trailer would be the best way to resume their favorite activity. When his wish day arrived. Cai received the surprise of a lifetime when his wish to have his very own camper was revealed in front of a packed ballpark. Over 100 of Cai's friends, family, and medical team came together to help celebrate. When asked what he thought about his wish, Cai shared, "It's the best day EVER."

On June 15th, the organization teamed up with the San Diego Padres to grant its milestone 5000th wish! Eric, a 6-year-old battling a brain tumor, dreamed of meeting his favorite baseball team. When Eric's wish journey began several months earlier, he was using a wheelchair while working to regain mobility he had lost during treatment. His medical team rallied around his wish and focused his physical therapy sessions on building the strength to walk onto the field and throw out the first pitch. Eric's wish served as constant motivation and on his wish day, he was so proud to walk on the field alongside his baseball heroes. For kids dealing with a critical illness, a wish creates joy in the moment and represents hope for a brighter future.


