Jazlyn's wish to go to a USA Track and Field Championship

Deep into cross-country season during the fall of her freshman year in high school, dedicated student and athlete Jazlyn noticed a lump in her chest.

Her parents took her to the doctor, where they started to run tests and did a biopsy. The results were shocking to everyone as Jazlyn was diagnosed with stage 4 Hodgkin's Lymphoma. She quickly began her treatment journey and, as a committed and driven student, she worked to have her chemo scheduled on Fridays so that she could rest over the weekend and not miss too much school.

Athletics and, in particular, Track and Field has been a passion of Jazlyn's since she was young. During her medical treatment journey, Jazlyn continued to be an active member of her track and field team.

When Jazlyn's social worker referred her to Make-A-Wish, she knew her wish would be something that she had always wanted to do and that was to attend a USA Track & Field Championship.

Jazlyn and her parents arrived in Oregon for the 2023 USA Track & Field

Outdoor Championship, excited to watch the events all weekend. Yet there were a few special surprises in store for Jazlyn. She not only got to attend and watch the events and professional athletes she admired, but she was also surprised with the opportunity to do a victory lap on the track and present the medals to the women's 400 Meters athletes. Jazlyn shared, "It was a surreal experience, and the best part was sitting next to amazing athletes like Sydney McLaughlin and Talitha Diggs. Doing the victory lap was an exciting surprise."

Vilma, Jazlyn's mom shared, "Jazlyn has done track since she was little and to see her with these professional athletes that she admires and for her to see that she is not defined or restricted by cancer was incredible. It was an opportunity for Jazlyn to see what she is capable of after cancer. Seeing her bright smile during that experience was amazing! We are grateful for Make-A-Wish. The wish experience for a child, whether they want to be a singer for a day or go to a track championship and meet athletes, shows that child that they are important, no matter what they are going through and to keep going". Two years on from her diagnosis, Jazlyn is happy to report she is in remission and recently qualified and ran in the Cross-country California State Championship!

Medical Community

Dr. Sarah Dabagh works in Pediatric Palliative Care at Kaiser Permanente. Dr. Dabagh refers patients to Make-A-Wish and helps us through the eligibility review process.

She shared about the impact of a wish, "The stories are endless, and we hear from so many families that wishes brought their families together, gave them something to move toward and to hope for, and helped highlight the spirit of the child in question. Thinking about past wishes, the first face that comes to mind is a young man with a serious illness who was nearing the end of his life and had spent more time in the hospital than out of the hospital



in his last year. His mother shared with our team that she had not seen him smile in months, and he was becoming increasingly withdrawn. Make-A-Wish was able to get him a meet and greet with his favorite actor, who was one of the first actors who ever made him feel truly represented in his favorite genre, and who himself was facing a serious illness. His mother shared that, that day, he gave the biggest smile she had seen in years. That smile, and that story, has stuck with me so deeply all these years later."
