Students and teachers with a dress code at their school can contribute a small fee to wear casual clothes or a hat to school for the day.

ICE CREAM SOCIAL

You scream, I scream, we all scream for ice cream! Host an ice cream social for your school's next fundraiser. Sell the ice cream plus an additional amount for toppings.

SPELL OUT SUCCESS

Teachers choose a list of 10 to 20 words for each grade level. Family and friends pledge a certain amount for each word the student spells correctly on a test taken two weeks later.

A twist on the traditional "a-thon" events, read-a-thons involve students receiving pledge donations based on the number of books or pages they read!
