




Meet Emilio,



Outstanding Youth Spotlight

Over the past two years, El Dorado High School (EDHS) student Ethan Yochum raised over \$23,000 by starting a Make-A-Wish Club on campus.

Ethan began his philanthropic journey by constructing cardboard donation collection boxes and placed them in over 80 classrooms at EDHS. He then inspired his classmates to promote Make-A-Wish's fundraising efforts and mission through all channels available to them including: social media, mass emails, flyers, and announcements. Local Wishes Spark Joy

As the garage door rolled up, 15-year-old Gavin was greeted by a sea of cheering supporters who were there for the reveal of a matte black electric bike – Gavin's wish had come true! After months in and out the of the hospital, Gavin's wish was the perfect spark of hope he needed to finish his last round of chemotherapy.

Gavin's health journey started out with fatigue and terrible migraines but progressed to full-body bruising and frequent nose bleeds. Gavin's mom, Stephanie, recounted the days leading to his diagnosis. "I just knew something wasn't right. So I took him to the closest emergency room." The following day, Gavin received the diagnosis of leukemia and immediately began the grueling regimen of daily chemotherapy treatments. After enduring painful lumbar

punctures, surgeries, and a PICC line, Gavin's child-life specialist introduced them to Make-A-Wish.

With this new reality of living with leukemia, Gavin missed the thrill of riding his dirt bike and spending time outside. As he underwent treatment, he was limited in what he could do. "I am not able to control all the power [of a dirt bike] at this time," he explained to his wish granters, "the SUPER73-RX Mojave is a bike that reminds me of my dirt bike, but is an electric bike. This would fulfill the thrill of riding."

On his wish day, Gavin was surprised when his family arrived in Irvine at the electric bike company, SUPER73's headquarters in Irvine. Little did he know that his wish was coming true!

While Gavin finishes his final round of chemotherapy, Stephanie says that since Gavin's wish day, his outlook has never been better. "We have had these bikes one week and he rides every day, I'm so proud of him. These bikes have brought so much joy to us as we ride together as a family. We love the outdoors, and these bikes were exactly what we needed. We feel so thankful, blessed and filled with joy. Thank you isn't enough!"







Partner Spotlight



The San Manuel Band of Mission Indians graciously awarded \$375,000 to help expand our wish-granting capacity in Riverside and San Bernadino counties, where over two-thirds of our local wish kids reside. This federally recognized Indian tribe has made supporting non-profits a priority through their Giving Pillar, and we are so thankful that they have included Make-A-Wish in their contributions. Since the pandemic, our wish granting program has faced severe challenges, and this grant will help make the wishes of 50 children in the area a reality. Currently, over 300 children in Riverside and San Bernadino still await their wishes to be granted, and we are so grateful to the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians for supporting our local wish kids.
