

Our mission is simple: together, we create life-changing wishes for children with critical illnesses and I'm proud to lead our dedicated team in carrying out this important work every day. As you read through our FY23 Annual Report and learn about the 222 life-changing wishes that were granted, you will also get to know our board of directors, staff, and volunteers who work together to make wishes possible. Families often say that dealing with their child's illness felt isolating, but the wish experience made them feel supported and cared for, often by people they had never met. This is why the Make-A-Wish mission is so very special, it brings people together.

Our national Make-A-Wish network is comprised of 58 local chapters, each serving kids in their own communities and for us, that means our wish families, medical partners, volunteers, donors, and staff all live here in San Diego and Imperial Counties. We are neighbors helping neighbors.

As each child chooses their wish, our team of volunteers and staff work together to plan the most meaningful experience, which always involves members of our community. Sometimes it's an established partner like La Costa Limousine, Playground Warehouse, or the San Diego Padres and other times it's an individual or business who hasn't yet had the opportunity to help grant a wish.



Wish Granting Steps

We have an ambitious vision — to grant the wish of every eligible child in San Diego and Imperial Counties. We believe that wishes change the odds for children fighting critical illnesses; it's why we do what we do. Wishes can help kids envision life beyond their medical conditions, decrease a family's anxiety, and bring entire communities together.



STEP 1 Referral

We rely on medical professionals, parents, and children themselves for referrals. A child with a critical illness over the age of 2 ½ and younger than 18 can be referred



Medical Eligibility

To be eligible for a wish, the child must be diagnosed with a critical illness that is currently placing their life in jeopardy.



Our dedicated wish-granting volunteers meet with the child and their family to help determine the heart of the child's wish.



Along with the support of the community, our team strives to create life-long memories by providing an unforgettable wish experience driven by the child's creativity.



Lizzie's Wish



Elizabeth "Lizzie" loves her family, her friends, and her pets. Two of those pets - pigs Moose and Marvin - are especially cherished, as they have helped 6-year-old Lizzie deal with numerous chemotherapy treatments, as well as various other procedures for her leukemia diagnosis. In fact, she loves her pet pigs so much that she was inspired to wish for a "piggy-themed play structure" for her backyard! Thanks to our corporate partner Genentech, along with community volunteers, her wish for a play structure became a reality, where she, her family, and her pigs can enjoy many outdoor moments together.

Lizzie's medical journey began with a sudden diagnosis shortly after her 4th birthday, leading to intense treatments. "It was a complete shock; we did not see it coming," Lizzie's mother said. Diagnosed with acute leukemia, Lizzie underwent chemotherapy treatment - including at one-point - daily chemo treatments for a month, lumbar punctures, and surgery for a chest port. Throughout it all though, her pet pigs Moose and Marvin provided comfort, solidifying their place as cherished family members.

Lizzie's wish day started with a classroom celebration and homemade cookies that were decorated with yellow ribbons symbolizing childhood cancer. A limo ride to Dave & Buster's to enjoy games while the structure was assembled followed. The highlight of the day was the surprise unveiling of her custom-built playground, accompanied by a rock painting activity with her friends. "My family and friends are amazing. I love them so much," Lizzie said about the day's events.

Lizzie recently rang the bell of triumph, symbolizing the completion of her chemotherapy.
