Noah was immediately taken to the Emergency Room for testing where doctors found cancer in his liver and small nodules in his lungs. Brave little Noah was diagnosed with metastatic hepatoblastoma, a type of liver cancer.

The diagnosis was a shock to his parents, who had just found out that Mom was pregnant with Noah's sibling. Their world changed overnight as Noah began nine months of chemotherapy. He also

had two lung surgeries, received numerous blood transfusions, and received a successful liver transplant. Noah's little brother was born at the same hospital after Noah received his transplant!

When Make-A-Wish reached out, his parents were unsure what to do for him since he was only 2-years-old. They knew he loved Legos and decided that Legoland would be a wonderful place to visit as a family. This would be the first time he would visit an amusement park, and Legoland would give him the space to be creative and have fun!

This was the family's first trip since Noah's diagnosis, so it was incredibly special to them. They also went during the week of Noah's birthday which made it even more significant. Legoland was the perfect place for Noah and

his family since they could set their own pace and Noah could enjoy everything around them. They stayed at the Legoland Hotel (the hotel dance party being his favorite part!) and had the opportunity to explore the San Diego Zoo and SeaWorld during their five-day stay.

Since his trip Noah continues to love Legos! Playing with Legos allows Noah the space to be creative and let his imagination go wild. It is an activity he can share with his younger brother, too. His mom loved seeing him have fun and just being himself on his wish. Legoland was the perfect place for all of them to have fun and be a family.

Nicole, Noah's mom, shared "I think Make-A-Wish is an amazing organization and they do make dreams come true for little kids like Noah. Just bringing the joy and hope they can to another child and family is just truly inspiring."


