Lemonade Stand Fundraising Tips

Top Fundraising Tips From These Lemonade Stand Pros:

- Make flyers about your fundraiser for Make-A-Wish and put them wherever you can. Ask local businesses if they will post your flyers.
- Get your friends involved! They can bake things, make posters, post flyers, and hold signs in the neighborhood on the day of your event. Celebrate together!
- It's better not to put prices on items. *Simply ask for donations*. People give more!
- Ask your parents to post about your "lemonade for wishes" event on social media and invite their friends to grab a cup for a cause.

Hosting a Lemonade Stand is a Learning Opportunity

Math

- Learn about income and expenses.
- Keep track of all expenses and income. (Bonus: make a spreadsheet!)
- Use your math skills to figure out the correct change for each transaction.

Social Skills

- Talk with your neighbors!
- Say please and thank you to customers.

Science

- How long do you need to boil sugar and water for the sugar to dissolve?
- Can sugar dissolve in lemon juice and room-temperature water?

Project Management

 Manage the fundraiser from start to finish - from setting goals to marketing the event.



Make-A-Wish traces its inspiration to 7-year-old Chris Greicius, a child with leukemia who wished to be a police officer. In 1980, a group of caring individuals came together and made his wish come true. The impact of Chris' wish was felt throughout his community and was the inspiration for what is now Make-A-Wish. Little did he know that his wish would create a movement that would transform millions of lives. As the largest wish-granting organization in the country, Make-A-Wish has granted hundreds of thousands of wishes to children with critical illnesses. Fast Facts

Last year, Make-A-Wish granted more than 16,200 wishes throughout the U.S. and its territories.

A wish is granted, on average, every 33 minutes somewhere in the U.S. and its territories.

A child is diagnosed with a critical illness every 20 minutes.

For every wish we grant, there are two more children with critical illnesses whose wishes need your financial support.

Did You Know?

8 out of 10

medical providers said a wish improves a child's medical outcomes.

9 out of 10

medical providers have observed that a wish increases a child's compliance with treatment.

8 out of 10

medical providers believe a wish is a necessary part of a child's medical journey.

10 out of 10

medical providers said they observed that the wish experience helps relieve families from traumatic stress related to their child's illness.
